## Major Housing Development in Barrow – an update

#### Jelson Appeal

Jelson Homes has appealed to the Planning Inspectorate following two refusals of planning permission to build 300 houses on the field behind Breachfield Road (The Breaches). Refusal of permission is based on a technical reason; the sub standard design of the South Street - Sileby Road - Grove Lane junction which would come into use by more traffic if the development were to go ahead. The appeal will be considered on the submission of written cases to the Inspectorate from all parties . Charnwood Borough Council will employ a planning consultant to 'robustly' defend the Council planning committee's decision. Barrow Parish Council and ourselves, BRAG, will also employ consultants to present our case, as third party objectors. BRAG would have preferred an Appeal Hearing where the inspector asks questions on the written submissions. Written submissions were due in to the Inspectorate by 8th June 2012 and a decision will follow.

#### Beat the Builders' Fund

BRAG was aware it would need to raise funds to represent the village's objections. Several fund raising events were planned including exhibitions and cake sales, which were well supported but we are overwhelmed by the success of the Beat the Builders' Fund. This fund raiser involved the delivery of a flyer with a donation envelope to all residential properties in the village. This raised funds to pay the professional fees of a planning consultant to prepare, write and submit our written case to the Inspectorate. We instructed Phil Rowlands at Landmark Planning, Leicester. The aim of the' Beat the Builders' Fund was to raise enough money to present the best case we could to the Inspectorate, to try to ensure a fair



decision, not one based on who can afford to spend the most on the Appeal.

#### We thank all who have donated to 'Beat the Builders' Fund' BRAG Aid and Picnic in the Park.

Our BRAG AID fundraising event was cancelled due to lack of support but we were able to successfully roll over the raffle prizes and (blind) auction items to the Diamond Jubilee event which took place at Humphrey Perkins School, not on the KGV park, due to the dreadful weather. Nevertheless, our stall was well supported. These fundraising events together have raised more than enough to pay the professional fees of our consultant who will present our case to the Inspectorate, on behalf of the residents of this village.

#### Strancliffe Hall, Cotes Road

Barwood Homes has submitted an application to build about 80 homes on land around Strancliffe Hall, Cotes Road. The application is due to be considered by Charnwood Borough Council Planning committee in 21st June 2012. There has been strong objection on ecological grounds from the Borough Council's ecologist. BRAG has undertaken a traffic survey, will submit its findings and will make a verbal presentation, opposing the development, to the Borough planning committee. Barrow Parish Council has also submitted a strong objection, as have a number of local residents.

## A return to retail life

At last, 5 High St (Morgan's Pine) returns to retail life after a year of emptiness.

ith all the paper work completed, licenses obtained and arrangements made, Darren and Lorraine Hickman are celebrating! But now, the really hard work starts as they prepare to convert 5 High Street into an up-market convenience store. It will be known as Best-One and will sell everything that convenience shops usually sell, even including a few newspapers! Barrow people are familiar with Darren and Lorraine in the Paper Shop but now their empire is about to double.

Darren explained that Best-One is what is called a symbol group. Best-One operates independent stores under its umbrella. It is the third most common in the UK (after Spar and Premier) and its stores are rapidly spreading. It is known for the quality of its fittings, both external and internal. It will sell Best-One own brands as well as top brands, with lots of very good special offers. As Darren pointed out, once the Co-op started selling newspapers and then National Lottery tickets, he and Lorraine had to find some way of gaining a share in other markets. They will keep the functions of the two shops separate so giving them lots of scope for very wide opening hours. Hickman Retail will provide truly convenience shopping in Barrow.



The Hickmans will continue their policy of supporting employment in the village. The expansion will offer new employment opportunities to local residents as well as the first step of employment to many more of our young people. They also intend to continue supporting community groups by providing free advertising and sale of tickets and hope eventually to be able to sponsor community events as their way of giving something back to Barrow.

## Lillian Hickling – A wonderful childhood and a teaspoon of honey

he item in the Autumn 2011 edition of Barrow Voice, about sisters, Joyce Sutton and Doris Hammond, stirred Anthony Riley to contact the BV team. He was keen to inform us that his grandma, Lillian Hickling, also has some wonderful memories and stories of bygone times in Barrow.



Lillian is possibly the oldest person living in Barrow. She was born on February 2nd 1914. She often entertains her children and grandchildren with tales about her memories of how life was in Barrow in her younger days.

It was suggested that Barrow Voice readers might like to hear some of her reminiscences. She was born Lillian Foster, at 5 North Street, a property that no longer exists, where she lived with her mother, father, three sisters and three brothers. The property would have been very similar to that described by Joyce Sutton. She attended the Top School, the school in Church Street and left at the age of 14 to take up a job at Drivers hosiery factory on Sileby Road.

Lillian didn't take to the work at Drivers so left to start a job at Wright's (elastic webbing manufacturers) at Quorn. She trained as a Warper and continued to work in Quorn for the next 14 years. In the early days of her employment she would walk with friends across The Slabs, to Quorn but after a number of years she was lucky enough to have a bike.

She married Cecil, always known as Cis Hickling, on Boxing Day 1936 at The Prims Methodist Church. Her wedding dress of white satin, was made by a Mrs Wright from material that was purchased at Loughborough market. The four bridesmaids wore mauve dresses of crepe de chine trimmed with purple sashes. The flowers were yellow chrysanthemums. The colours sound fabulous. The reception was held at the Cotes Road primary school.

After a brief spell of living in Freestone Square when she first married, Lillian and Cyril lived in New Street for 40 years and their daughter Marie was born there. The couple moved into a bungalow in Bryan Close when Lillian was aged 72. It was the first time she had lived in a property with a bathroom.

Lillian told me she felt she had a

wonderful childhood. She, like Joyce, used to take her father's hot dinner in a basket, over the fields to Ellis's where he worked. I can imagine that there must have been almost a swarm of young girls snaking across the fields up to the cement/concrete works on Sileby Road as I've heard similar stories from a number of people that had to make this journey so dad could have a hot meal at lunch time.

However, the most vivid memories that Lillian recalled were from her childhood and were about helping the publican, Mr Illston, of the Three Crowns with his carrier business. The house, on North Street, where Lillian lived, shared a yard with the pub. This is where there were stables for the horses and outbuildings, including a coach house, where the Landau (a very smart, open topped horse drawn carriage) and the Brake (a horse drawn carriage for paying passengers) were stored. The Landau could be hired for weddings and would be polished and trimmed with white ribbons and the horses with white feathers. On these occasions Lillian was expected to paint the hooves of the horses white. Another duty was to paint them black for more sombre occasions like funerals.

Now Lillian lives comfortably in her bungalow and is visited daily by one or other of her grandchildren. Friends and other family members call in regularly. I'd like to thank Lillian for sharing her memories and wish her continued longevity.

She celebrated her 98th birthday in February this year. I asked her if she had a secret for her long life. She shrugged her shoulders as if to say, not really, but then said she does have a spoonful of honey in her tea every morning!







The 30th Anniversary of the Charnwood School of Dance and Drama was celebrated in style with all of their students performing in honour of this achievement. The performers were amazing in their performances from the youngest of the dance and drama group to the older and more experienced of the group, the dances were perfect and brilliantly done. With carefully practised routines and well thought choreography the performances created the perfect entertainment for the 30th anniversary celebrations.

he grand finale of the show saw old faces return to the stage to perform for their teachers Helen and Rachael. Some of the first ever students that attended the school performed the Hungarian Tap Dance dressed in the traditional Hungarian costume having been a popular dance when it was first performed. Some of the students, now bring their children to the school started by Helen Stephenson from Barrow upon Soar. It was quite an emotional evening for the founders of the school as the original students had put in the time and effort to practise the dance for the show. There was also a speaker phone call from one of the students, as she now lives in Australia, to give thanks and share the celebrations.

In 1982 Helen Stephenson who wasn't yet 19 decided that with the help of her brother Mark, she was going to pursue her ambitions of setting up a dance and drama school. Using Barrow's Trinity Church Hall Helen and Mark were able to hold their first ever class. Having completed a two year



course in dance and drama the family knew how to create a successful performing school and it is still going 30 years later! Since that first class the school has seen more than 250 over the years. Many students have gone on to work in the performing arts as either teachers or as professional dancers. The school has reached its 30th anniversairy by adapting to new styles of dance whilst still keeping the traditional forms and sometimes combining the two to make sure that the students learn, experience and enjoy the classes to the full. The day after the show there was a party for the original students. It gave them a chance to catch up with each other. Old stories were remembered and memories were reminisced. It was a lovely surprise for Helen, Rachael and Mark who have worked very hard to create the school and build it up from what it was. Starting in the village of Barrow the school has gone on to a bigger studio in Loughborough growing in size over the years.









## Barrow's Diamond Jubilee Wet but wonderful

n June 2nd the Queen went to Epsom and 'Camelot' won the Derby. In Barrow however Tim Allen was having a street party! He thought of the idea in the pub, sent dozens of flyers round to the other forest-dwellers in Birch, Elm and Ash and put up the bunting. On the day a goodly number turned up with extra food and children ready to play games. In the best traditions of street parties they cooked burgers, drank beer and prayed it wouldn't rain. But apart from Tim's street party Barrow Voice didn't hear of any others.

On June 3rd the Queen celebrated by sailing down a grey Thames in a grand but chilly barge. In Barrow we stayed warm and dry having our picnics and festivities in Humphrey Perkins High School to avoid the endless rain. But in spite of the change of plan the event went off extremely well with visitors and stall holders alike saying how much they enjoyed it all. A big thanks to the Parish Council for providing the funding to make it happen in the first place, and to Judith Spence and her BUSCA Youth Action team for their hard work. Of course the picnic should have taken place in King George V Park only the rain had been so constant the grass was sodden and the flag so depressed it couldn't even flutter.



### Plan B

In the morning, immediately it was known Plan B was going ahead, a willing army of workers moved in and with little ado transformed every inch of HP's ground floor – foyer, hall, stage, bar, restaurant and lounge into a cheerful red, white and blue festive scene with bunting everywhere except in the toilets. As a consequence by the official starting time of 1pm everyone was set up and ready to go.

Outside Barrow Scouts had erected a gazebo for their hot-dogs and were frying onions and slitting their first buns not far from the stocks. These ancient village stocks (!) proved to be amazingly popular in spite of the rain as children dragged their parents to play 'Off With His Head'. After all it was only 50p for three wet sponges and you can't often hurl something at your Dad. Mark Squires said he was more or less in charge but admitted he couldn't have done it without youth club members Ryan, Tom B, Tom H, Ashley and Dan.

In the main hall Barrow Gardeners with their trowels and 'special' children's Jubilee petunia plantings were easy to see messing about in soil by the window next to visiting artists with their craft cards and jewellery and then came Fairtrade's healthy food. Across the hall the Conservatives had set up their crowded Bric-a Brac stall followed by two tombola stalls – side by side but quite different as one was bottles based and the other filled with Barrow Junior's cuddly toys. BRAG (Barrow Residents Action Group) needed the whole of the bottom corner for their three pronged attack - raffle, blind auction and cakes, against Jelson's plans for that large Barrow field they're determined to keep as a field. The BRAG cake with its decoration of a new Jelson house being demolished by a tiny JCB underlined the point brilliantly in icing!

#### **Best in Barrow**

To find the rest of the stalls and the 'Best in Barrow' competition you had to wander into Humphrey P's long restaurant area. There Helen and Mark Sadler were in charge of a wonderful display of entries, a fantastic showcase of local talent from cake baking to painting and photography. Unfortunately Barrow Voice hasn't got the space to list the prize winners here but they will be displayed on the Community Notice board outside the library. Helen wants to send a huge thank you to her judges: Anneka Collier from Peppercorns (cakes) Linda Taylor (greetings cards) Judith Rodgers (recycled items) Betty and Mary from the WI (chutneys and preserves) Chris Bates(paintings) and Liz from Elizabeth Michael (photographs) – she's truly grateful.

It was much noisier further along as there was great fun to be had at The Barrow Pre-School Play Group stall where little ones could have a go at easy indoor games or pick a lolly and win a prize depending on what colour stick it had – two prizes in one! And children were also winning prizes nearby at the 'Friends of Humphrey Perkins ' stall by hooking ducks or lifting up little lids. But there were quieter moments amongst the children at the Soar Valley Guides stall where Frances and Linda were helping them to decorate their own biscuits into royal crown designs - lots of sugar and lots of fun – but it seemed you definitely had to think hard before you placed your silver balls.

#### **Royal Memories**

Opposite the Guides the WI had a fabulous display of pictures going back over the years bringing back great memories of previous royal occasions. They were giving away cup cakes too if you filled in a form expressing interest in joining them. Surprisingly two young lads filled in two lots of forms for the Women's Institute and of course got two lots of cakes. Bright lads they'll do well.

#### **Called to order**

Every village needs a strong Town Crier to start off a Royal Party so it was good that Barrow has a loud one. At 1pm David Dipple rang his bell, called his loyal villagers to order and asked our magnificent Queenie, panto dame Richard Bailey to cut the tape. This was done with giantess elegance – pity a tremendous explosion occurred just when she bent down! Her comment about the tape being stolen from the A6 was unworthy of a royal personage and totally unjustified.

Immediately afterwards the band 'Sound Like Swing' began to play and the afternoon took off in earnest. The band played classic American songs of the 30's and 40's and made a really valuable contribution to the day filling in odd gaps between activities as well as playing their own sets. The activities varied a lot from the morris-women of Anstey, with bells on their clogs, hoofing it in the hall, to the Hall Orchard Recorder Group playing beautifully for twenty minutes followed by children's games involving much enthusiastic running around in circles or in and under a huge 'parachute'. Nobody seemed to miss the egg and spoon or wheel barrow races that should have taken place outside on the grass.

#### Our own King and Queen

In 1953 at 3.30 pm our present Queen was crowned in Westminster Abbey so in 2012 at 3.30pm Barrow too had a coronation only we went one better - we crowned a king as

Summer 2011 and the Royal Wedding. I was given the BV "roving reporter" role and loved visiting all the different street parties interviewing organisers and taking photos. It was such a sunny day and the whole village was enjoying itself.

### If you had to describe yourself in one word, what would it be?

Can I have two? Generally cheerful. I tried to get "brilliantly competent" past those at home but no luck.

### Do you have any pets and if so what do you have and what are their names?

No, not now, but we have had in the past. I like dogs a lot. A loving lazy mongrel called Tinker came with the house in Brazil. We had a mad rescue dog called Badger in Sileby but he was too much for us and had to go back. In Barrow we adopted Nipper, a lively Jack Russell cross, and he stayed with us until the end. He'd been owned by a deaf old man and trained to bark when the phone or door bell rang. He wasn't popular with the pianist in the family!

#### How long have you lived in Barrow and why did you decide to come and live here?

We'd returned from Brazil in 2006 as my husband David (Spiller ) had retired from the British Council and taken up a post at Loughborough University. His colleagues advised him to live in a village but not Quorn - early morning traffic problems. At first we rented a large quirky old house in Sileby ( it had its own old bread -oven ) but decided on an easy to run David Wilson in Barrow. No regrets.

#### What would be your ideal holiday?

We love the Edinburgh Festival Fringe, dashing around between the shows, but I also get a lot out of long-haul workingholidays. Since 2006 I've been back to Shanghai four times, working as a summer visitor - a replacement IELTS (see later) examiner for a month. I'm also very much looking forward to working in Delhi for two months up-dating a guide book to Old Delhi I co-wrote in 1988. We'd lived in the city for five years by then so knew it well. It's been up-dated before; this will be the third edition. In the last edition (2002) the Delhi Metro was only being built, not up and running as it is now, so there's a lot of updating to be done.

### Do you have a day job? If so what do you do?

No, but a week-end one! I work for Warwickshire College , Rugby Centre, as an IELTS examiner. We work on Saturdays and Mondays - six days a month max. - perfect. IELTS , the International English Language Testing System is like an A level in English for foreign speakers wanting to enter British universities. It's much in demand at present.

Sorry, haven't got one.

### What are your hopes for the future of Barrow Voice?







One in four people will experience mental distress at some point in their lives. Many sport stars and celebrities have recently mentioned in the press that they suffer from depression.

Physical exercise is a very good coping mechanism, especially Zumba. People often remark how much better they feel once they've left a Zumba class, especially after a difficult day. I've even had, on occasion, two participants who came to my class after bereavement, in order to cheer themselves up. It became more apparent just how much it meant to so many when I recently recorded testimonials. Several people remarked that they suffer from depression and it had been a great escape for them to come to Zumba.

## **Parish walks and Plague**

ast year's Parish Walks were very well supported in comparison to the previous year. I'd like to mention just a couple of them here and hope that readers will be encouraged to join in with the 2012 programme.

Over 20 people took part in the walk to Cotes Mill (I15) which is quite strenuous due to the number of stiles involved. I found it quite challenging as the stiles are tackled twice over as the walk is linear, so you climb them on the way there and clamber/struggle over them on the way back! However, it is a lovely and unusual walk and worth the effort. It would be good to see the same numbers taking part as last year.

The other walk worth a mention was the one from Woodhouse Eaves, where walkers need a lift to the car park in the centre of Woodhouse Eaves. The route takes you along the side of the village cricket ground then by the brook that flows along the lane at the bottom School Lane and brings you to Pestilence Cottage. Last summer the group stopped to read the plaque, outside this picturesque cottage, that explains its unusual name. It's linked to Thomas Rawlins who came to live here to escape the great Plague of London in 1865. If you want to see the full text you will either have to walk by the cottage or access it via the internet.

While the walkers were reading this tale one of the group became engaged in a conversation with the owner, who was watering his plants. Suddenly, we were all invited in to have a closer look at the pretty cottage garden and to see his miniature ducks in a small pond at the back of the property. It made an interesting diversion to our evening ramble.

This year's programme of walks will include some of the favourites, Miller's Bridge is definitely there plus a new one that includes a walk around Cotes but cars will be needed to get to the starting point. There was a Jubilee Walk around the village which included many of the village's interesting buildings, and incorporate jitties, the Millennium Park and the river. ## **Update on Strancliffe Hall**

So far I've received two comments about Strancliffe Hall in response to the article in the last Barrow Voice.

gentleman rang me to say he had carried out some work for the last owners, Mr and Mrs Ipasso. He had been commissioned to fit drapes and blinds in a number of rooms and recalls that one day he was fitting blinds to an upstairs window when he thought he was seeing things. He shouted to his assistant to confirm what he was seeing, namely the roof of the swimming pool that appeared to be moving. The swimming pool had a retractable roof so when the weather was warm enough the roof could be drawn back to make an outdoor pool!

He also recalled Mrs Ipasso telling him

that a bed he was making drapes for had once been owned by Napoleon. During the time that the Ipasso family lived at Strancliffe the house was beautifully furnished and decorated. The same man recalls an enormous cut glass bowl that was displayed on a table in the hall under the atrium as well as a room with a pure white carpet and his concern about the red brick dust that might cause a stain when he had to drill the walls to fit the new blinds.

The other memory comes from someone who was a member of the Holy Trinity Young Wives Group in the 1960's when the Towle family lived in the house. At Christmas the group went carol singing around the village to raise funds for a nominated charity. They had been invited to Strancliffe and the group were asked inside, to stand on the curved staircase in the main entrance, to sing. They sang their carols and were rewarded with seasonal drinks and mince pies.

Thank you for sharing these memories of Strancliffe and if anyone else has any other recollections about past events or life at Strancliffe I would love to hear from you.
